- **STANDARD SIZE** 0.5m² Slabs
500mm wide (19.6")
1000mm long (39.3")
- **SOIL THICKNESS** 20mm (0.78")
- **WEIGHT PER M²** 20kg – saturated weight may be up to 25kg
- **GRASS HEIGHT ON DESPATCH** Approx. 100mm (4"). The product is mown before despatch to minimise damage to plants. It will not be in flower when it is delivered.

All measurements are approximate and taken when harvested.

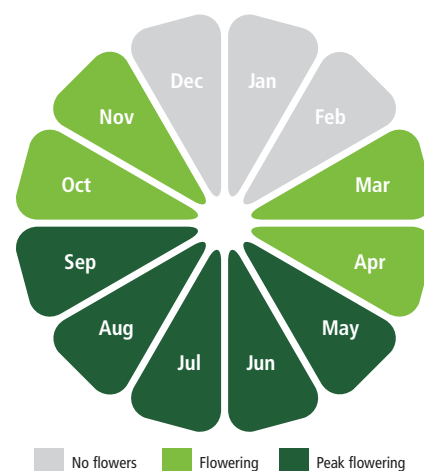

The annual species will provide interest while the others establish and the perennials will flower every year if the conditions are suitable. The specially selected grasses ensure coverage all year round. Turfonline Traditional Meadowmat® will contain mature plants, root fibre and enough soil to maintain the plant during establishment.

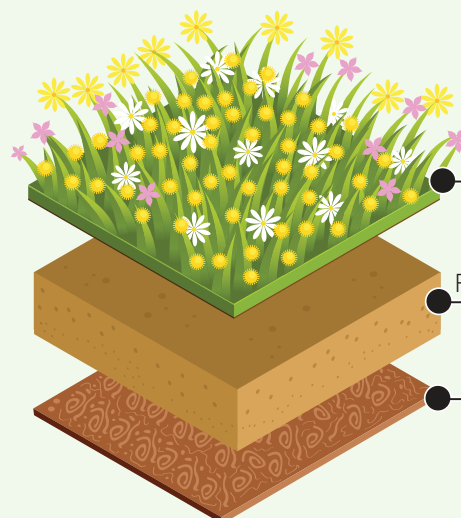
